WUSD BUDGET OUTLOOK

The District's positive budget certification by the Yolo County Office of Education is a result of prudent fiscal management coupled with ongoing cost savings programs such as the Solar Array Project at River City High School. These measures help to ensure that K-3 class sizes remain at a 20:1 student to teacher ratio—while many school districts across the region are increasing class sizes, the WUSD has placed a high priority on maintaining our ideal class sizes for our students.

To ensure continued financial prudency and positive budgeting, the Washington Unified School District is looking ahead at muchneeded deferred maintenance and safety improvements at each of the school sites.

Therefore, the District will be meeting with parents and community members over the next few weeks to discuss and prioritize the types of school improvement projects that would continue to ensure that we are providing the best education in modernized and safe facilities. RIVER CITY HIGH SCHOOL MOCK TRIAL TEAM COMPETES IN STATE FINALS



The River City Mock Trial team competed as Yolo County Champion in the State Finals tournament in Sacramento and finished with its best season ever with a defense victory over Mono County and a prosecution victory over Madera County. One of their two losses was a razor-close 237-231 loss to Tulare County. River City finished 17th out of 32 schools, their highest state ranking.

This year's Mock Trial Case, People v. Buschell, focused on murder and the right to bear arms.
